THE PRE-MBA PROGRAM or the summer **business concepts program** provide an opportunity to complete your master of business administration (MBA) degree in one academic year of study, instead of the traditional two years. Students can select the general MBA track or pursue a track in global supply chain management, environmental management, or innovation and new venture management. The MBA program is fully accredited by AACSB.

AS AN UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT, you must complete the listed business foundation courses at the undergraduate level with a grade of “C” or higher. Courses may be included in the required portion of your undergraduate program, and in some cases, they are electives. If you are unable to take the required business courses during your four years at Clarkson, you may also complete any or all of these classes during our summer business concepts program (<http://www.clarkson.edu/mba/curriculum/concepts.html> for further information). You can also transfer courses taken during the summer at other universities with prior approval from our office.

IF YOU ARE CONSIDERING AN MBA, it is important to choose your undergraduate courses wisely, particularly if your undergraduate major is in arts and sciences or engineering. You are encouraged to discuss your plans with the graduate business program office as well as your adviser.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND GRADUATE POSITIONS: Scholarships are awarded based on the overall strength of your candidacy and in particular; your GMAT/GRE score, undergraduate grade point average (last 60 credit hours), and three letters of reference. Students are also eligible to apply for a graduate assistant position and earn up to \$1500 per semester.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

1. clarkson university application for admission form, completed and signed (can also be completed online). **The application fee is waived for clarkson undergraduate students and clarkson alumni applying to our program.**
2. The graduate business office will run the official transcript for work completed at clarkson university via peoplesoft.
3. An official score from the educational testing service for the graduate management admissions test (GMAT) or the general record of examinations (GRE). At the end of your junior year, or early in your senior year, you should plan on taking either the GMAT or GRE test.
4. Three letters of reference (forms provided with application packet or can be completed online).
5. A current resume.
6. Two essays (an additional optional essay is provided)
