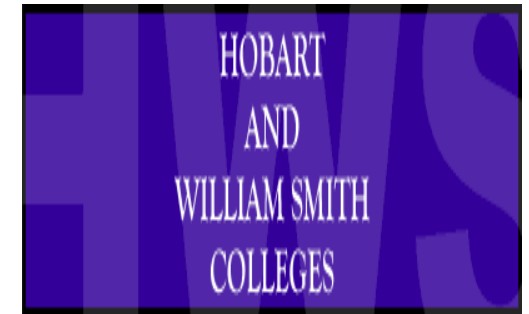

Hobart and William Smith Colleges and Clarkson University have established an agreement that allows Hobart and William Smith students to plan their undergraduate program to include courses that serve as a foundation for graduate study in business at Clarkson. These foundation courses include material required in the first year of study in the Master of Business Administration (MBA) program at Clarkson. Students who plan their undergraduate program carefully are able to earn an undergraduate degree from Hobart and William Smith College and an MBA degree from Clarkson in five years. If necessary, any remaining foundation courses may be taken at Clarkson during the summer Business Concepts program.

WHAT IS THE MBA PROGRAM? The Clarkson Master of Business Administration program prepares students for leadership positions within an increasingly global and technological work environment. The MBA degree is fully accredited by AACSB.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND GRADUATE POSITIONS:

Scholarships are awarded based on the overall strength of your candidacy and in particular; your GMAT/GRE score, undergraduate grade point average (last 60 credit hours), and three letters of reference. Students are also eligible to apply for a Graduate Assistant position and earn up to \$1500 per semester.
