Degree Progress

Degree Progress: This important tool allows you to plot the courses you have taken against the requirements of your degree. Although not every major and minor has an audit fully developed, this still can help most students and allows one to determine progress towards completion of knowledge areas, and accumulation of communication points.

This report is for planning purposes only and may be used as a reference. Official completion of degree requirements may only be determined by the academic department responsible for your major. All questions should be referred to your advisor or academic department.

The resulting report will include the advising transcript for reference, then will begin the Degree Progress report. This compares your transcript (including in-progress courses) to the requirements for each Career, Program, Plan and Sub-plan to which you are tied. Career is Undergraduate; Programs are Engineering, Business, Arts and Science and Other (University Studies); then each major, minor (plans) and concentrations (sub-plans) may be evaluated. Few minors or concentrations have audits set up at this time. Each major (plan) is evaluated separately so it may cycle through requirements more than once.

Requirement groups not satisfied will display in Red; specific requirements not satisfied will be in Bold.

Course List What-If Analysis

This functionality provides a tool to confirm how courses selected may apply towards degree requirements. Classes can be entered, then a revised degree progress report run.

This is accessed via the same Degree Progress link. *If you have just run a degree audit transcript, it will be necessary to return to this link to reset – by again selecting Degree Progress.*

Choose an institution and report type and press go to view your degree progress in your current academic program. If you wish to view your coursework in a what-If scenario, select one of the buttons below.

VIEW A REPORT THAT YOU HAD PREVIOUSLY REQUESTED

Select the Course List What-If button, then enter the subject only (such as MA for Mathematics), or use the magnifying glass  to search for subject values, then hit the SEARCH button, which will display all MA courses (be sure to View All). *Note, the courses displayed are all currently active courses – not necessarily those courses being offered in a particular semester.* Select the desired What-if Course. To add another course, **Add a Course** . Repeat until all courses are entered. Then hit OK.

Quick What-If Analysis

This functionality will allow you to see how courses would be used towards a different major. Since all majors are evaluated independently, the What-If major will replace the current major. *If you have just run a degree audit transcript, it will be necessary to return to "View My Advisees" to reset – by again selecting Degree Progress.*

All values must be filled in through Plan Override and Required Plan Term, even if there is no change. Fill in the proposed Career (UGRD), program, plan, sub-plan, if applicable. In the right column, enter the term against which requirements are to be measured. In the example above, the student entered and is being measured against the catalog in force for Fall 2005.

Again, by clicking on the magnifying glass next to the fields, search tools can help you discover the proper code to use.

When you hit OK, a new report will be displayed measuring the student's coursework against the new major's requirements.
