Things to Bring

You should bring the following:

- Clothing (informal summer attire)
- Sweater, sweatshirt and/or jacket
- Bathing suit
- Non-marking athletic shoes
- Raingear
- Dress clothes for the Group Project Presentation
- Flashlight
- Alarm clock
- Fan
- Laundry detergent
- Lock for lockers
- Personal identification
- Insect repellent
- Toilet articles (soap, toothpaste, etc.)
- Sunscreen
- Wash cloth
- Notebook
- Pens and pencils

You may wish to bring other items including: beach towel, hangers, stationary, stamps, camera, portable radio, etc. Please do not bring large or valuable items (i.e. stereo systems, TV's).

Blankets, sheets, pillows, pillowcases, and bath towels will be provided.

Transportation

Bus service to Potsdam is provided by Adirondack Trailways (from Syracuse, Rochester, Buffalo, New York City, and Albany). Transportation will be furnished from the Potsdam terminal to the residence halls without charge, provided that you inform The Clarkson School of your arrival and departure plans in advance.

Registration, Housing and Food Service

Young Scholars participants will be housed in the Price housing complex.

Registration will take place from 4:00 to 5:00 p.m. on Sunday, July 12th in the Price Hall Center Core (see campus map). Young Scholar participants are expected to depart following the 2:30 p.m. presentation of certificates on Saturday, July 18th.

Health Clinic

Health Clinic service is available to students in the Young Scholars program at a designated area on campus. The clinic will be staffed by Emergency Medical Trainers twenty four hours a day. EMT and CPR/first-aid-trained campus safety proctors will be on call throughout the evening and night hours.

To help with diagnosis and treatment, it is essential that the staff have on hand in the clinic a *Health History Form* **and** an *Individualized Order Form* for each student. Under New York State Health Department regulations, **you cannot be admitted to our campus without having these forms completely and correctly filled out.** Please see that the enclosed forms are filled out, signed and returned to The Clarkson School by June 30, 2009. Please note the necessity for health insurance to cover medical treatment for illnesses beyond the capability of the Health Clinic.

Some Important Rules

While attending Young Scholars, Clarkson University is responsible for your well-being. Please be aware of our policies, which are simple.

➤ No participant is allowed to leave campus on his/her own at any time for the duration of the program except in the case of an emergency or with specific, written parental consent. Should an emergency arise, you must immediately notify Rick Campbell, Young Scholars Director, who will then contact your parents.

➤ Participants may not use automobiles or motorcycles during the program. They will be parked in a lot designated at registration. Participants must turn in all copies of their vehicle keys at registration.

➤ Alcoholic beverages, tobacco, use of illegal drugs or gambling are not permitted.

➤ State law prohibits any firearms or weapons in dormitories. Neither are allowed on Clarkson's campus or in Clarkson facilities.

Violations of the above may result in dismissal from the program!

Young Scholars participation represents a weeklong commitment. We hope that students will be permitted an uninterrupted immersion in the program.
