

Fall 2019 GRE® Prep Course

The Graduate Record Examination (GRE®) is taken by prospective graduate students who plan to apply for admission to a graduate level program of study. GRE® test scores are used by colleges and universities throughout the country as an indicator of general verbal, mathematical, and analytical writing ability. The GRE® score is viewed by admissions officers as a significant predictor of performance in graduate programs.

The GRE® exam currently consists of three separately timed sections focusing on verbal, quantitative and analytical writing skills. The verbal section measures reading comprehension, as well as verbal and analogical reasoning skills in a multiple-choice format. Tested in the quantitative section are basic concepts of arithmetic, algebra, geometry, and data analysis, your ability to reason quantitatively, and solve problems in a quantitative setting. The analytical writing section measures your ability to articulate and support ideas, and to analyze arguments. Our instructors place emphasis on test content as well as sound test-taking techniques and strategies. Adequate preparation is imperative to success on the GRE®; the key to test taking is having confidence in one's knowledge and ability.

The majority of class time is devoted to examining each area of the GRE® in depth, exploring the rationale behind correct answers, and understanding the underlying principles that apply to related questions. Our instructors are professional college level math and English teachers who are dedicated to helping you achieve the best score possible. All courses begin with a diagnostic test, which will help the instructor evaluate each student's strengths and weaknesses. Class size is limited to ensure individual needs can be addressed.

The course is divided into two components: Verbal Review (which includes Analytical Writing) and Math Review. You may enroll in the components separately, if you are well aware of your particular areas of ability. If you feel you can benefit from a review in both areas, please register for both the Verbal and Math Review components.
